Fortunately, only three of those species are most likely to invade homes in the U.S. Those three are carpenter ants, odorous house ants, and pavement ants. To prevent them from dominating your home, there are a few steps you can take.

Carpenter Ants

Carpenter ants burrow into wood that has been compromised by moisture or decay to build permanent nests. Piles of wood shavings are often evidence of a carpenter ant infestation. *Performing regular inspections, especially during and after the rainy season, is one of the best ways to prevent an infestation.* To avoid the growth of fungus that causes decay, it's important to take the necessary steps to preserve your wooden structures. One of those steps is maintaining a protective coating of paint.

Odorous House Ants

Odorous house ants build temporary nests in multiple locations, which can make an infestation more difficult to

eliminate. These ants often live in the vegetation surrounding homes. *One of the steps you can take to prevent* an infestation is to ensure that none of your shrubs, plants, flowers, or other vegetation comes into direct contact with the structure of your home. These ants are attracted by the aroma of human foods, so storing food in sealable containers and taking garbage out more frequently during summer months are other important steps you can take.

Pavement Ants

Pavement ants also build nests in multiple locations to accommodate their many queens. They are sometimes called mason ants because they move the sand from beneath sidewalks, patios, and driveways. As anyone who has encountered them while outdoors enjoying a backyard barbeque can tell you, these ants have a stinger. *To prevent them from entering your home, you should regularly inspect windows, seams, and doors for any gaps that could provide them easy entry.* Any cracks or crevices in walls or floors should be promptly repaired.
